Cirrus High School to Close After 2018-2019 School Year

Rosendale-The Rosendale-Brandon School Board voted at their April 22 regular meeting to discontinue funding Cirrus High School at the end of the current school year. The board cited concerns with sustaining student enrollment, attracting and retaining quality staff, and funding as the reasons behind closing the school.

Cirrus High School is a student-led, project based charter school established by the District in 2013 and was designed to serve up to 40 students. In its first year, Cirrus served 27 students, but enrollment has steadily declined in each of the following years with just eight students enrolled this current year.

Cirrus was created by the district to give another option for students who wanted more voice and choice in their education. According to the Cirrus website, "The primary education model used by Cirrus High School is project-based learning (PBL) with a focus on leveraging and integrating arts and technology as bona fide components of an integrated, comprehensive curriculum that lends itself to the gamut of learning styles. PBL fosters not only a hands-on, interest-based approach to understanding and learning specific facts, procedures and outcomes, but also an awareness of how the process of understanding and learning occurs and can be applied to a wide spectrum of situations throughout life. Through intrinsic motivation, the PBL approach creates a deeper level of comprehension and a greater capacity for self-actualization through individualized instruction."

District Superintendent Wayne Weber stated, "I am sad to see Cirrus closing its doors. A number of people put a lot of time and effort into the development of Cirrus, and as a concept, I believe it is a great way to learn for a number of students. However, with difficulty maintaining qualified staff and decreasing student interest it was a prudent decision."

Current students are working on completing projects so they can transition to Laconia High School. Some students have expressed interest in enrolling in other charter high schools outside the District.
