In past articles, I have written about the process the District is going through to develop a Long-Range Facility Master Plan. We have great schools, filled with excellent people, but it's no secret that our facilities are aging. Our newest school and additions are almost 25 years old while the majority of the rest of the facilities range from 50 to 70 years old. We have been doing our best to address the maintenance needs of our facilities, but we need a plan for how to best address the current and future needs of buildings and the staff and students that



learn and work here. This all-encompassing facility plan will align the district's current reality, strategic direction, and the community's desired future state of facilities.

I previously stated the plan will be created with input from a variety of stakeholders including community members, business partners, and parents. As a district, we are at the point in the process where we are seeking community input through the creation of a Facilities Advisory Committee (FAC). In this edition of the *Spartan Sentinel*, you will find a FAC Member Application. (A link to the application can also be found on our website or you can contact me for an application.) As you will see in the application, we are hoping to fill the 18 seats on the committee with a diverse group of community members.

These 18 community members will combine with our nine board members to create the FAC. This committee will look to address the following elements:

- identify and address facility, safety, security, space utilization, and research-based educational appropriateness in an efficient and cost-effective manner
- modernize aging and inefficient facilities
- provide facilities that support student academic and extra-curricular achievement, contribute to college and career readiness, and support professional learning
- increase opportunities for independent, small group, and large group learning
- operate safe, energy-efficient facilities that facilitate learning in a sustainable manner

To assist in this process, the District has partnered with Plunkett Raysich Architects, LLP (PRA) and C.D. Smith Construction to conduct a facilities analysis and an educational space analysis. Among other tasks, the FAC will review the information in these analyses and tour facilities in order to identify and prioritize options for long-range plans.

I'm excited to be moving forward in this process with the creation of this committee. What a great way for members of our community to have a direct impact on the direction of the District! If you are interested in being a part of the planning process, please complete an application form and get it to me by November 13. More information can be found on the application form.
