
The fall play will be *Quaran-Teens* written by Laurie Allen and directed by Leah Demski. This powerful collection of 15 original monologues explores a variety of teen responses to the pandemic and the safer-at-home restrictions that came with it. From restoring old friendships and keeping traditions alive to missing baseball, graduation, prom, and so much more, each monologue offers a unique, true-to-life point of view of this real-world crisis. *Quaran-Teens* celebrates the resiliency of teens, who, despite feeling lonely and sacrificing their own special moments, maintain an element of hope for a brighter future.

In order to keep everyone safe, our process for this production has been a little different. Auditions were held virtually, with actors-to-be sending in videos of themselves reciting a portion of a monologue from the show. Rehearsals are all done one-on-one or via Google Meet. Instead of a live show, the production will be filmed. All recording sessions are also one-on-one to limit risk as much as possible.

When every monologue has been filmed, Mrs. Demski will put it all together into a seamless show that will be approximately an hour long. DVDs (or flash drives) will be sold instead of tickets, so theater patrons can enjoy the show from the comfort and safety of their own homes.



Many things have changed since last March. The sudden appearance of Covid 19 interrupted many sports and clubs; including the SMART (Students Modeling A Research Topic) team. Last March, the SMART team had just completed their collaboration with Dr. Ken Brockman PhD. of the medical college of Wisconsin and was preparing to present our model of M1.HypAVI. M1.HypAVI is a methyltransferase protein involved in ear infections. The model highlighted the structure and function relationship of this protein as it exists in the bacteria *Haemophilus influenzae*. Even though the SMART team never got a chance to present their work, the 2019/2020 SMART team is proud of their work and their model is on display in the cabinets across from Laconia High School room 207. This year, due to changes at the Milwaukee School of Engineering, the SMART team will be transitioning to the MAPS (Modeling a Protein Story) team. We will still be researching proteins and making models to connect protein structure and function. However for the first time the MAPS team will be 3D printing their own models in house. The team plans to set up a 3D print shop at Laconia. This exciting new change will open up new learning opportunities for MAPS members.
