Course	Pre-Kindergarten Course Description	Grade Range
Fun for the 4K Student	This class is for children who will be entering 4-year-old kindergarten in the fall. Lessons are designed for younger students with an emphasis on the special parts of the school setting. Students will be introduced to circle time, calendar, art, letters, math, music and fun! Students will have a daily snack and outdoor time.	This class is for all students who will be entering 4K this fall.

Course	Kindergarten Course Description	Grade Range
ABCs and 123s: For the Kindergarten Student	This class is for children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall. Lessons are designed for the young student with special emphasis on independent and group functioning, classroom-structured rules, following directions and class expectations. <i>Reinforcement and advancement</i> of language arts, mathematics, science, fine arts, and physical education skills will be presented daily.	This class is for all students who will be entering Kindergarten this fall.

Course	First Grade Course Description	Grade Range
Moving on Up to First Grade	This class will provide the opportunity for students to use a variety of activities to achieve stronger skills in fundamental areas such as letters/sounds, blending, rhyme, creating/reading/writing simple words, and reading/writing simple sentences. The class will also provide the opportunity for hands-on projects, which reinforce the areas of color, size, and shape.	This class is for all students who will be entering First Grade this fall.

Course	Courses for Grades 2-3 Course Description	Grade Range
2D Art Projects FEE: \$8	Sharpen those pencils and grab those brushes. Students in this class will get their creative juices flowing while constructing a large variety of painting, drawing and printmaking projects. Be sure to bring your own art smock or apron.	2nd & 3rd Grades
Bookin' & Cookin' FEE: \$10	Students will read new stories each day. Then, they will help to make a snack that relates to the book, and (as time allows) do a craft project related to the book. For example, if students read <i>If You Give A Moose A Muffin</i> , they'll then help make muffins, and then draw and write about their favorite part of the story.	2nd & 3rd Grades
Getting Ready for 3rd Grade (grade 3 only)	Are you looking for a class that will get you ready for the upcoming school year? This course reinforces the concepts taught in second grade reading, writing, and math. The students will have opportunities to review reading comprehension strategies that they have learned this past school year through read alouds, listening to stories, reading to themselves, and writing in a journal. Students will have the opportunity to practice addition and subtraction skills, review basic facts daily, and word problem strategies. If your student earned 1s and/or 2s in reading and/or math during the last school year, this course is highly recommended.	3rd Grade ONLY
Impact of Play & Imagination FEE: \$5	Students will be encouraged to play and imagine through centers that allow them to use play & their imagination with a variety of building materials and/or crafting projects. They will create using items such as Lincoln Logs, Legos, blocks, magnets, puzzles, sidewalk chalk, stamps, paper, & other materials. In addition, they will be able to use puppets & use stories to travel to new places. They will have opportunities to play board games that teach skills and strategies.	2nd & 3rd Grades

Nature Center Adventures	This class will be outdoors every day (weather permitting) engaging in a wide variety of activities designed to strengthen students' minds and keep them active. There will be reading, writing, science and math activities related to the many exciting features of the great outdoors.	2nd & 3rd Grades
Soon to be a Second Grader (grade 2 only)	Are you looking for a class that will get you ready for the upcoming school year? Students who need or want extra practice to develop fundamental math, writing, and reading skills will benefit from this block of instruction. Teachers will utilize a wide variety of daily activities, such as active learning strategies, and individual and small group lessons, to differentiate reading and math instruction to students' areas of need. In addition, students will participate in hands-on projects that reinforce reading and math skills while also allowing students to explore high interest science and social studies concepts. If your student earned 1s and/or 2s in reading and/or math during the last school year, this course is highly recommended.	2nd Grade ONLY
Space Exploration	Climb aboard for a hands-on journey through the galaxy. How big is outer space? Do aliens exist? Is there life on other planets? We'll try to answer our questions by reading non-fiction texts about space and space travel. We'll also have some fun by reading fictional stories about space and aliens, creating space themed art projects, and writing our own creative stories about adventures in outer space.	2nd & 3rd Grades

2D Art Projects FEE: \$8	Sharpen those pencils and grab those brushes. Students in this class will get their creative juices flowing while constructing a large variety of painting, drawing and printmaking projects. Be sure to bring your own art smock or apron.	4th & 5th Grades

Backyard Games	Love spending gorgeous summer days outside being active? Then this is the class for you. Students will participate in a large variety of outdoor games and activities, which are sure to keep them moving and laughing.	4th & 5th Grades
Creative Dramatics	Creative drama is imagination-based, improvisational play. Students will explore and discover hearing, speaking, visual motor, problem-solving, and decision-making skills through guided theatre games. Examples of these games include: <i>Making a Monster</i> , <i>Actor in a Box</i> , <i>Explosion Tag</i> , and <i>Who is the Leader?</i> Students will spend 2 weeks playing theatre games and exploring and building their own creative skills, then we will turn to more tangible efforts. The final 2 weeks of the program students will work together to write, stage, rehearse, and perform an original 10 minute play. Performance may be open to invited guests.	4th & 5th Grades
Cooking Smart FEE: \$15	Learning to cook healthy snacks and meals on a reasonable budget will be the focus of this class. Students will learn about the origins of their favorite foods, investigate and practice fundamental food preparation techniques and proper food safety procedures, explore the nutritional value of foods we eat, plan healthy meals and snacks based on what is on sale in local grocery stores, and actually prepare (and eat) some meals. Students will also create their own recipe book filled with healthy meals and snacks they can prepare themselves!	4th & 5th Grades
From Book to the Big Screen!	Did you know that many of today's most popular movies started as books? Movies such as <i>Diary of a Wimpy Kid</i> , <i>Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day</i> , and <i>The Lorax</i> were all based on books! Games Galore	<p>Turn off the electronics in this class geared toward indoor games. Learn how to play a variety of board and card games and even challenge your friends to a tournament in games of your choice! Games include Clue, dominos, checkers, chess, Rummy, Minute to Win it Games, and much more!</p>	4th & 5th Grades

Course	Courses for Grades 6-8 Course Description	Grade Range
2D Art FEE: \$10	If you enjoy a relaxing atmosphere in which you can express your creativity or your love of art by painting with watercolor, acrylic, tempera, and oil based paints, drawing, sketching, cartooning and papercrafting then this is the class for you! Come learn new techniques while working on perfecting the skills you already have. You will bring home around 15 completed projects, including a canvas oil painting!	6th - 8th Grades
Babysitting (Ages 11+) FEE: \$8	In this course students will develop an understanding of children and their stages of development. They will apply their knowledge to real-life situations and learn skills to minimize any need for discipline. Role-playing scenarios will be used to help babysitters build decision-making skills. Students will create games and play them with children of babysitting age. Students will study first aid, Heimlich maneuver, a beginner course of CPR, and will have opportunities to learn proper diapering and potty training, spoon and bottle-feeding, bedtime routines, and dressing techniques. Students will experience making healthy snacks and learn how to prepare/cook basic foods. They will also have a chance to create business cards and flyers to promote their new babysitting skills. A local police officer will also present information on safety concerns and protective measures. This course is certified only by Rosendale-Brandon, but mimics the current course offered by the Red Cross	6th - 8th Grades
Brain Benders	Students will explore the logic portion of the brain by working through logic puzzles. It will test students' determination and grow the brain while having fun. We will work on brain benders such as Sudoku, Break Out Boxes, Scavenger Hunts, and Brain teasers.	6th - 8th Grades

Projects and assignments will help students sharpen their skills in these areas. Organization and study skills will also be reinforced.	6th - 8th Grades
Spartan Strength and Conditioning Program	This class enables students to improve their flexibility, strength, speed, and agility. The class will enable students to understand the science of strength training, set goals, monitor progress, and establish healthy eating habits. Workouts will include Free Weights, Flex Bands, Kettlebells, Medicine and Core Balls, and Sports Specific hand/eye drills. Students will be required to wear proper workout attire daily (shorts, socks, shirts, and athletic footwear) to participate in workouts.	6th - 8th Grades
