PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR STAFF

The Rosendale-Brandon School District is committed to supporting our entire staff to become engaged in the career readiness process. To this extent, we will be providing our staff with resources and strategies to effectively guide students in their academic and career pursuits. Focus will be aimed on career exploration techniques, best practices in academic advising, and emerging trends in the job market. Our goal is to equip all staff with the tools and skills necessary to ensure that students receive personalized guidance and support throughout their academic and career exploration.

Career Readiness is for ALL of our Students

INDIVIDUALIZED ACP SUPPORT

 Our district providea modifications, accommodations, or enhanced support for career readiness to maximize participation of English Learners, students with an Individual Education Plan (IEP), or students at-risk of not graduating.

ACCESS FOR ALL STUDENTS

If a pupil is a child with a disability, the pupil's academic and career plan shall be made available to the pupil's individual education program team. The pupil's individualized education program team may, if appropriate, take the pupil's academic and career plan into account when developing the pupil's transition services.

In addition, the following programs are available to students with an IEP:

• The PAES Lab (Practical Assessment Exploration System) is a vocational setting which assesses student's aptitude and interests by completing tasks in 5 career areas. These career areas are: Business/ Marketing, Computer/ Technology, Process/ Production, Construction/ Industrial and

- Consumer/ Service. As annual IEP's occur, a Student Summary Report is compiled and shared with stakeholders, including families and state agencies (ie- DVR) on the student's success in this setting.
- Students are exposed to a variety of transition assessments that will help to define areas of need when
 looking into post-secondary education, daily living and vocational skills. The menu of resources listed

- Learning for Independence (LFI) is a cooperative transition program offered in partnership by Fond du Lac Area High Schools and Moraine Park Technical College. The students range in age from 18-21 years, have a documented disability and are current students at various Fond du Lac County High Schools. The LFI Program assists this population in job exploration, community outreach and daily living skills.

CAREER READINESS TECHNOLOGY

Students in the Rosendale-Brandon School District utilize Xello to engage in College and Career readiness activities to help them identify and evaluate their future goals.
